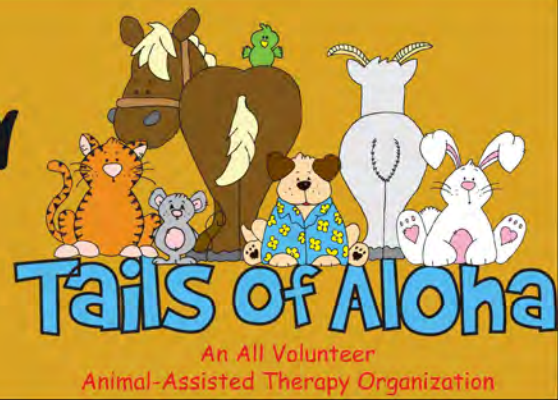

Canine Influenza

The first vaccine against the canine influenza virus was recently granted by the Department of Agriculture. The vaccine is available for use by veterinarians in the United States. CIV is a highly contagious

resouratory infection that is dangerous to dogs who are housed in kennels, shelters, or any communal area. The dogs begin to cough anywhere between two to five days from the time of infection, with coughs lasting up to three weeks or longer. The symptoms are so simliar to kennel cough, that it is nearly impossible to confirm CIV without a blood test for antibodies against the virus. The dogs may also develop a high fever.

Most dogs have no immunity to CIV because it is a new pathogen thought to have mutated from the equine influenza virus H3N8. the new vaccine has shown to reduce the severity of lung lesions as well as the duration of coughing and viral shedding. The vaccine is made from the inactivated virus.

Adventures at Kalaeloa

This past July I realized a dream. As a member of United Animal Nations, Emergency Animal Rescue Services (an animal rescue organization), I would read of their involvement in numerous animal rescues such as Hurricane Katrina, the California wildfires, the flooding in the Midwest, etc. Along with the stories are photos of volunteers so happy to be making a difference in the lives of these animals. I would think to myself, "one day I am going to be that volunteer in the middle of a RESCUE."

In July I got my chance! I had the privilege of working along side UAN EARS, Humane Society of the United States, Oahu SPCA, Cat Friends, Tails of Aloha, and many others on the largest animal rescue in Hawaii. We built kennel after kennel from rolls of chain link fencing, the volunteers working hard and focused. Giving water and food to 130 dogs and 100 cats being brought to the shelter. I was helping with the dogs, seeing them arriving by the truckload, some so scared they didn't want to come out of their portable kennels, others sad, and still other confused. And yet there were others with love in their eyes who simply wanted to hear a comforting voice. I admired the skill, professionalism, and CARE each of the organizations had in getting all of the animals safely contained in a matter of two days.

At the end of each day, every one was extremely tired and dirty, yet our hearts were filled with the love that comes from these wonderful animals.

I work full-time with my husband, volunteer at the Hawaii Humane Society, Oahu SPCA, and am turning my hobby of making handmade dog blankets into a business called BarkingDogBlankets. Inspired by my 15 year old Blue Heeler, my blankets go from the home to the car to keep the fur, dirt and sand off the car seat and couch. BarkingDogBlankets are island chic yet practical. Since I love animals so much (especially dogs) every month I designate a portion of my sales to an animal welfare organization. So far we have been able to send a small donation every month. Some of the organizations that have received donations are the BooBooZoo, Muttville, Epic Farms, Siberians Needing Owners, Hawaii Dog Foundation, Sasha Farms, Hawaii Humane Society, Little Hen Rescue and this month a portion of our sales will go to Tails of Aloha.

I believe that every little bit that I donate is helping, but what I really dream of, is selling enough blankets to REALLY make a difference for these rescued animals and wonderful organizations that are out there helping to do every little bit they can.
