**August 28 will be here before you know it...** Did you know that Tails of Aloha is the **first** and only pet foodbank in Hawaii supported by the Hawaii Foodbank? Our problem is we lack the funds and adequate storage to provide animal food to everyone on a consistent basis. ## Peanutties

- 1 stick butter
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 bag peanut butter chips
- 1 small bag shredded coconut



- Graham cracker crumbs
- 1 bag butterscotch chips
- 1 bag semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Melt butter in 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan. Remove pan from heat and cover bottom with crushed graham cracker crumbs, pushing down with a fork (for crust). Pour condensed milk over crumbs. Cover pan with butterscotch chips, then peanut butter chips, finishing with semi-sweet chips. Coer with shredded coconut and gently press down with a fork. Bake for 20 minutes. Remove pan and cook for a half hour. Cover with aluminum foil and place in refrigerator until hardened. Cut into rectangles and serve in paper cups.
