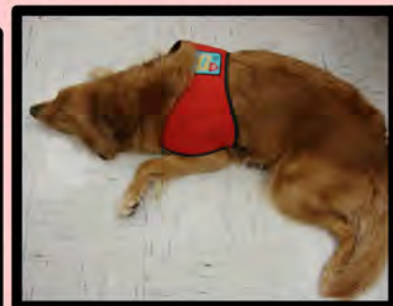

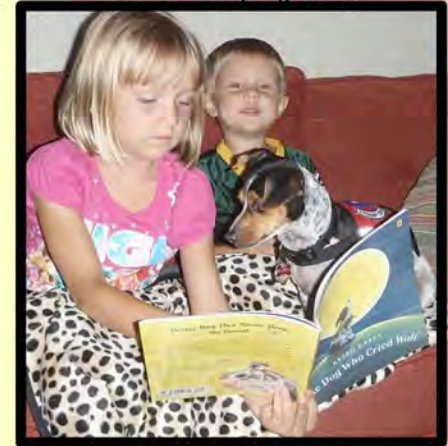

# Nail Care

Recently we've been seeing a lot more owners experiencing problems with trimming nails.

If a nail injury occurs, you can try soaking the paw in some warm water with some Hawaiian salt.

The homeopathic remedy would be to use hypericum.

If it is a major paw injury with raw tissue, clean, and use Calendula ointment mixed with hypericum tincture, then wrap the paw. Change the wrap daily and soak the paw in a Calendula tea bath. Paw should be fine within ten days.

To get your pet used to having their nails trimmed, holding and gently stroke and massage the paw to get them used to their paw being touched. Have your treats ready, it may take several days to complete the trimming as you will only be trimming a nail at a time and providing praise and a treat. Never rush the trimming.

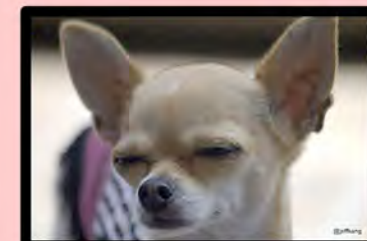
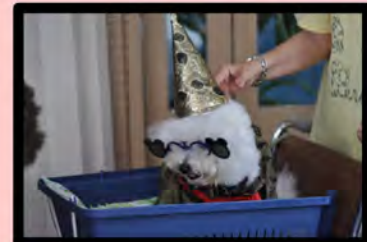
# Pets and the Plaza
