Willy and I visited the children at Kulana Malama the other day. Willy is an eight year old Golden Retriever therapy dog who has worked with children his entire life. As all the children are on trach tubes and hooked up to machines, many cannot sit up or talk. Willy skillfully maneuvered his body around to each child so he could look into their faces and they could pet him. To him, each was a precious child. We saw smiles and peace come to the children's faces because they could feel him. Who can describe the gifts of such a sweet and loving dog!

Sophie who is another Golden, and my service dog is two years old and understand approximately 30 commands. She helps me when I am dizzy and retrieves anything for me. Sophie is very intuitive about what I am feeling. Those are her "service skills" but it would be unjust to say those are her best skills. First and foremost, she is my companion and goes everywhere with me. She loves to go to places and behaves perfectly. People always stop and want to talk with us and pet her and tell us their stories. Although the American Disabilities Act does not consider the loyal friendship of a dog, a trained skill that helps a disabled person, truly they are not naming the best skill of all, that a dog provides to a disabled person. Perhaps in the coming years, this will change and people who have less noticeable disabilities will be allowed to have the blessing of a dog accompany them everywhere. If the standards for the dog were high, excellent training, and skills, well cared for, so they would be a welcomed extension of that person. I wonder just how much this might change the atmosphere of our world to be kinder better one.

Although Megu is already none years of age, she is still has her puppy qualities about her.

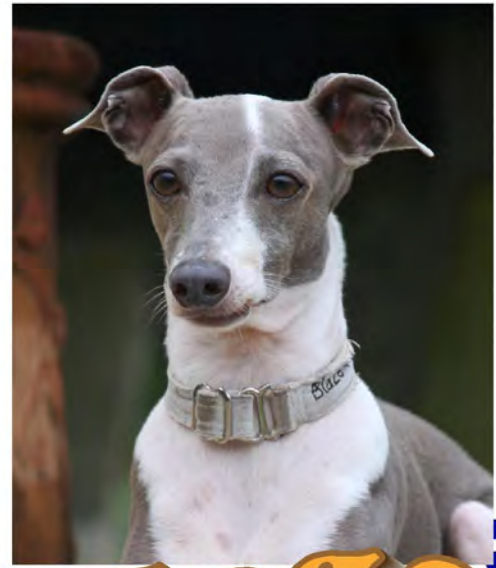
